Purpose: This form allows you, an employer with a self-funded employee plan, to participate in the Utah All Payer Claims Database (APCD) and authorizes your plan administrator to submit your data.

Background:

- Since 2009, state law has authorized the Utah Department of Health to collect data on Utah health care claims for all Utah residents into the APCD.
- Information about cost, quality and utilization patterns from the APCD provides invaluable insights to
 employers, researchers, policy makers, payers, and the health care industry about opportunities to
 address rising health care costs and improve quality.
- The accuracy of the information relies on having data that is as complete as possible, so it is important that employers continue to contribute data.
- Due to a 2016 United States Supreme Court opinion, Utah is no longer able to require administrators to submit self-funded data directly to the APCD. Employers can voluntarily agree to participate and have their data submitted to our APCD.
